Food Bank of WNY annual report for FY 2018-2019 and stub year 2019

a message from our board chair and president & CEO

The period of July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2019 was an exciting time of growth and change for the Food Bank of WNY. The most historic accomplishment during this 18-month period was the Food Bank's merger with Meals on Wheels for Western New York.

The journey to FeedMore WNY – the nonprofit created out of this alliance – began in 2017 when the Food Bank and Meals on Wheels embarked on a comprehensive study to determine if a merger was in the best interests of the organizations and the community. A task force comprised of board members, staff and community volunteers from both nonprofits worked incredibly hard to conduct a thorough analysis of the organizations' business models, challenges, opportunities and risks as well as how best to position them for success and sustainability in the future.

The task force agreed that, by coming together, the new organization would make a greater impact in the community and touch even more lives. On February 27, 2019, the nonprofits' boards voted to come together as FeedMore WNY. The New York State Attorney General officially approved the merger on December 31, 2019.

In this report you will see an overview of our service numbers and financial results from the Food Bank of WNY's 2018-2019 Fiscal Year, as well as our six-month stub period before the Food Bank became legally merged with Meals on Wheels. We are deeply grateful to everyone who helped make this next great step in eradicating hunger in Western New York possible, and we look forward to your continued support as we work to provide dignity, hope and a brighter future to our neighbors in need.

In any given month, the Food Bank of WNY assisted as many as 131,776 people throughout Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Erie and Niagara counties during FY 2018-2019, distributing 12,856,971 pounds of food to community members in need. From July 1, 2019 through December 31, 2019, the Food Bank assisted as many as 116,771 people in any given month, distributing 6,525,217 pounds of food to community members in need.

* The Food Bank also provided 102,483 pounds of food to partner food banks in the Feeding America network in FY 2018-2019, and 141,433 pounds of food to partner food banks in the Feeding America network from July 2019 through December 2019.




